## **Spexhall Parish Council Website Accessibility Statement**

The Parish Council believe that as many people as possible should be able to use this website. For example, that means you should be able to:

- change colours, contrast levels and fonts
- zoom in up to 300% without the text spilling off the screen
- navigate most of the website using just a keyboard
- navigate most of the website using speech recognition software
- listen to most of the website using a screen reader (including the most recent versions of JAWS, NVDA and VoiceOver)

The Parish Council has also endeavoured to make the website text as simple as possible to understand. <u>AbilityNet</u> has advice on making your device easier to use if you have a disability.

Unfortunately, some parts of this website may not be fully accessible:

The Parish Council does not plan to add captions to live video streams because live video is exempt from meeting the accessibility regulations. The accessibility regulations do not require the Parish Council to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018 if they are not essential to providing our services.

This statement was prepared on 23rd June 2021. The Parish Council used the methodology described in "Website Accessibility Requirements" produced by the National Association of Local Councils (NALC). This website was tested using the Microsoft Accessibility Insights for Web tool recommend in that publication.
